

"Over the last five years, 38 interns have passed through our doors. Of those, 73% gained work at the end of the scheme, compared with national figures of just 6.8% of people with learning disabilities and 16% of people with autism. I am immensely proud to be part of a programme which provides life changing opportunities and this scheme has been the highlight of my career to date"
