REASONS TO READ

The average person reads 100,000 words a day, from social media, tv, emails or books. But did you know deliberately reading:



Exercises your brain

Brain connectivity increases while reading and for days afterwards which strengthens it for the future!



Engages and increases your imagination

Which helps you come up with new and interesting ideas in other areas



Helps you learn new things

Including facts, and other information about different cultures, social situations and events.



Reduces stress

Even six minutes of reading can reduce stress levels by more than 66%!

In a recent study, reading was found to be the best way to reduce stress - compared to taking a walk, having a cup of tea or coffee, and playing video games.

HOW CAN I READ A BOOK WITHOUT GETTING

BORED?

Make time for it

Clear your mind for one minute before reading

If you don't like the story, change it!

Take occasional breaks

Keep your book close to you

ACTION AND ADVENUTRE



Action and Adventure usually involves an adventure, risk taking and often action and physical danger, think spies or jumping out of exploding helicopters!

Animals



Animal Fiction is where the story, characters, and plot, all involve animals. Animals can be active or passive characters. An Animal can be the central character, a narrator, a villain, a hero etc.

CLASSICS



FANTASTIC TIMELESS NOVELS



Classic Fiction is a work of fiction that is exemplary or noteworthy, often transcending generations and continuing a still relevant message.

Fantasy



Fantasy is a type of fiction that focuses on magical and supernatural elements that do not exist in the actual world, such as powers, curse, gods and goddesses, and mystical beings such as vampires, demons, witches/warlocks and fairies

FRIENDSHIP/FAMILY/ EMOTIONS



This genre is a mix of stories with themes including feelings, identity, social issues and relationships.. These could involve friendships, family, or romantic relationships.




Though "Graphic Novel" is a format, not a genre, they can be fiction. A graphic novel is a type of comic book. As the name suggests, it features the use of graphic art, but in a narrative form.

HISTORICAL FICTION



Historical fiction is a genre where the plot takes place in a setting in the past, such as WW2 or the Victorian age, but the plot is fictional

HUMOR





The humour genre is made up of books about a series of funny or comical events or scenes that are intended to make the reader laugh

MYSTERY & THRILLER

Crime WHO-DUNNIT MURDER Investigations

The mystery genre follows a crime (like a murder or a disappearance) from the moment it is committed to the moment it is solved, often called "whodunnits". Thrillers are fast-paced novels full of conflict, tension, suspense and unexpected twists. This often overlaps with mystery.

Sci-Fi & Dystopian



Science fiction stories often take place in the future and involve fictional aspects of science and technology.

Dystopian fiction explores social and political structures. It is a creation of a nightmare world, for example the Hunger Games or Maze Runner

SPORT



Sports fiction is a story where a sport has a specific impact on the plot or main characters.

SPOOKY/HORROR



Horror is a genre that is meant to scare, startle, shock, and even repulse audiences through frightening themes like demons and gore.

WHICH LABEL

In each fiction book you should find labels that will tell you about the books themes: Lots of books will have multiple labels, because they include multiple themes.

Most labels will be the same as the book genre. For example, a book in the science fiction (sci-fi) section will have a sci-fi sticker. But it might also have a friendship sticker, as the key theme in the story is people surviving together and forming friendships.

You can use these labels to narrow down which book you would like to borrow.

For example, if you wanted a book about friendships but not about family, you would need to look for a book in the freindship/family/emotions section WITHOUT a family label.

Here are the labels currently in use: -


Reading through the App
