

## Rewards

Rewards are given to pupils in line with the school values of:

**Respect, Resilience, Confidence, Motivation, Aspiration, Integrity**







In addition, pupils can gain rewards for academic achievements; involvement in enrichment activities and clubs; being a good citizen; reading and writing.

In primary, pupils receive stickers which they collect on their reward cards.

The Secondary department uses “Edulink” software to record rewards.

Parents and pupils can view the achievements online or via the “app”.

As a pupil’s total of stickers in primary or points in secondary grow, they receive additional incentives for their achievements as shown in the table below:

## Rewards



### Post 16

As part of preparing for adulthood, Post 16 students do not access the same reward system as the rest of the school.

Post 16 students work towards intrinsic rewards that focus on the school values of Respect, Resilience, Confidence, Motivation, Aspiration, and Integrity.

All students are involved in enterprise projects which generates an income, which is then used to reward students such as paying for activities, as would happen in a work environment.

We foster that all students work together as a team and are rewarded as a team all working towards the same end goal.
